Yeovil Town Mayor, Councillor David Recardo, is seeking nominations for the 2020 Mayor's Award. As in previous years, a Silver Salver will be awarded to an individual or an organisation providing a tangible service to the community, as a small token of recognition and thanks on behalf of the Mayor and the Town. The Award is not intended for people who earn their living from their services but who provide a service out of the goodness of their hearts.

Last year's winner was awarded to Valerie Murley for her involvement in fund raising for the Bloodwise Charity for over 46 years. Past recipients include: Lynn Lee Brown for her wonderful work with Castaways, Caroline Faithful for her enthusiastic volunteering at the Day Centre, Liz Pike for developing and promoting the arts and culture in Yeovil, Pete Ridler for his many years of service to the Westfield Community and Beryl Garton for her continuous work for the Good Fellowship Club and Milford Hall Community Association.
