9/161. MINUTES

9/162. SPEED INDICATOR DEVICE RESULTS

The Committee considered the report by the Deputy Town Clerk. The Deputy Town Clerk added that she had received a response from the Traffic Engineer at County Hall regarding the question raised at the last meeting about the current policy on the intervention limit – it was confirmed that the recent changes in legislation would not alter the intervention limit in any way as the 10% “allowance” on speeding offences had always been at the discretion of the police.
