11/191 PEDESTRIAN CROSSING REQUEST AT KINGSTON / HIGHER KINGSTON

This report is for information only.

At the May 2024 meeting of the Buildings and Civic Matters Committee a request for a pedestrian crossing at Kingston/Higher Kingston was considered. It was resolved:

- that the committee do not support the request for a pedestrian crossing at Kingston/ Higher Kingston;
- that the request is forwarded to the Area Highways Office, stating that the Town Council do not support it, but they do have concerns about the safety of people crossing the road at that location, and request that the Area Highways Office investigate how to ensure the safety of pedestrians, such as dissuading crossing at that point or devising an alternative scheme to allow safe crossing at that location.

An email was sent to the Area Highways Office on 23rd May 2024, and a response received on 26th September as follows:

In "responding to the ask, in order to comprehensively assess we would need to undertake a feasibility study with today's guidance and strategic intentions in mind, with less focus on capacity improvements and more focus on active travel which may produce a different outcome. A feasibility would require funding and at this time we have no funds to commit to investigative works.

The area does feature in the Yeovil LCWIP [Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plan]. As this develops, there may be opportunities to explore further. Extracted below for your information sections in the vicinity of Fiveway RAB that feature in the Yeovil LCWIP".
